


THE SXM AIRPORT HORIZON

Following the successful mold remediation and testing procedure in the ground floor of the terminal building, the reconstruction of the Princess Juliana International Airport (SXM) has now officially commenced. Both projects are part of the Package One - Temporary Operations.

It will be recalled that the airport facilities sustained severe damages at the hands of hurricanes Irma and Maria in September, 2017. Commercial operations were restored on October

10, 2017, a little over a month after the storms forced the closure of the facilities. The Radar and Automation system of the Air Traffic Control (ATC) tower were also damaged and are expected to be fully operational again before the start of the high traffic season.

Commodore N.V. has been awarded the reconstruction contract after the procedural procurement process was completed. The construction company will only be responsible for completing the build-out for Package One - Temporary Operations, which consists of partial works on the ground floor of the terminal building. Specifically, this will include the build-out of temporary check-in counters, immigration and emigration booths, offices, installation of security equipment, CCTV and reinstating the inbound/outbound baggage conveyor belts.

Project Manager, Rob Normaan, said the contract also calls for the installation of the air-conditioning systems, sprinkler and fire alarm system, reception area, IT systems, seating and provisions for the retail and Food and Beverage related concessions.

According to the Managing Board of SXM Airport, made up of CFO and Acting CEO, Ravi Daryanani and COO, Michel Hyman, the updated timeline for the completion of the Package One - Temporary Operations project is now December, 2018. After the temporary operations become fully functional in the Terminal Building, the arrival and departure pavilions will be dismantled. The completion of the project is expected to coincide with the beginning of the high tourist season.

Also, the omega profiles were seen being hoisted onto the roof of the terminal building weeks ahead of the installation. The omega profiles are the frames on which the roof panels will be installed. Phase 2 of the roof works of the SXM Airport started in July 2018. The bull noses and soffits are being replaced. Ballast Nedam is the main contractor of the roof repairs. Phase 2 of the roof works is slated to be completed between the end of the year and the beginning of January.

SXM AIRPORT HONORS THREE AT FIRST-EVER "SECURITY DAY"

Three employees of the Princess Juliana International Airport (SXM) were honored with awards for their heroic efforts at the first-ever Security Day celebration held on Sunday, October 14, 2018. Andrew Rombley, Clyde Boasman and Jubert Spanner were the honorees of the event. Honoree, Clyde Boasman was absent for the celebration and would later receive his award. The ceremony was also addressed by the Safety and Security Inspector of the St. Maarten Civil Aviation Authority, Raymond Jacobs.

Speaking at the ceremony, Michel Hyman, COO of the airport noted that "All over the world, airport security has become priority number one, especially in the aftermath of 9-11 and continuing threats of international terrorism." He said this crucial aspect of the aviation industry is usually handled directly by government agencies, however, in the case of St. Maarten, "airport security is not executed by any government body." "This important function was officially delegated to the Princess Juliana International Airport operating company, PJIAE N.V. on October 14, 1977 as indicated in the Publicatie Blad 1978," Hyman explained, adding: "That is why October 14th, has been chosen as Security Day, to celebrate and honor all our security personnel who have been doing a tremendous job in ensuring the safety of the hundreds of thousands of



passengers, airline staff and others that make use of our airport facilities on a daily basis, all year round." He said he considers it "a big vote of confidence in PJIAE N.V. that the St. Maarten government would charge it with such a great responsibility."

"Safety and Security have always been priority number one for us, and the performance of our security personnel has shown that this is not just a slogan. We live by it. We train for it. We abide by it. We invest heavily in it," he told the gathering.

the backbone of our operations here at the airport, you have also demonstrated that you are top-notch professionals in your field. I salute you today on this auspicious occasion and wish you abundant blessings and God's guidance as you continue to make the Princess Juliana International Airport one of the safest airports in the world."

Security Day will be observed from now on as an annual event at SXM Airport.



SXM AIRPORT SHINES AT STUDY AND CAREER FAIR









The Princess Juliana International Airport (SXM) took center stage at the St. Maarten Study and Career fair on Tuesday October 30, 2018 at the Belair Community Center in Cay hill. Modifications will also be made to the lounge for the luxury traveler. The new design now calls for a two-story building, as the FBO operators will also be housed on the premises. The FBO operators include ExecuJet and Arrindell Aviation by Signature N.V.

Sending "kudos to SXM Airport for pushing forward with this development," Matumi Shigemoto, General Manager, Arrindell Aviation by Signature Flight Support at SXM Airport said: "This new development of our current facilities of the FBO building is extremely welcome. It will
