NEW ARRIVAL TRANSIT CORRIDOR

The practice became a growing pattern, since the airport's operation returned to the terminal building post hurricane, with only 35% of the damaged building in use.

We are elated to divulge that the Management Board of the SXM Airport officially approved the implementation of the new arrival transit corridor, which went live on Saturday January 18, 2020.

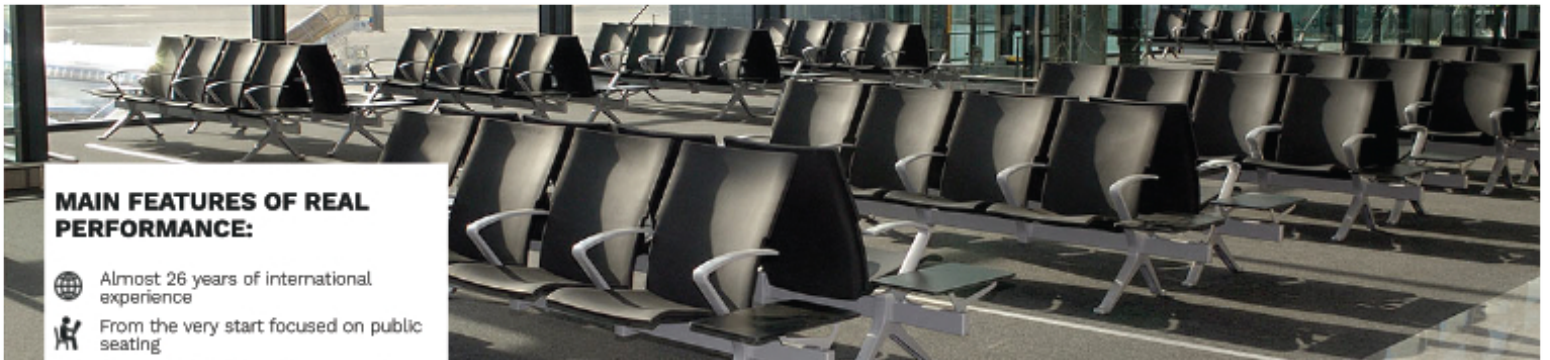


While the transit passengers will make their way to the security check points, the visitors and residents will join an alternate cue onto the immigration booths.

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SXM AIRPORT APPOINTS SECOND CFO TO THE PJIAE N.V. MANAGEMENT BOARD

Mr. Stavast succeeds Mr. Ravi Daryanani who was previously awarded the dual leadership roles of the CFO and CEO on November 6, 2017.

Mr. Stavast initially took office as the Financial Advisor effective August 1, 2019 to serve a duration of a two-year term. He now takes the helm of the Princess Juliana International Airport - SXM with the Chief Executive Officer, CEO, Brian Mingo and the Chief Operations Officer, COO, Michel Hyman.

Stavast, specializes in strategy and financial management of major projects. He acquired a Masters of Science in Business Administration with a Post-Master in Finance and Control. Today,

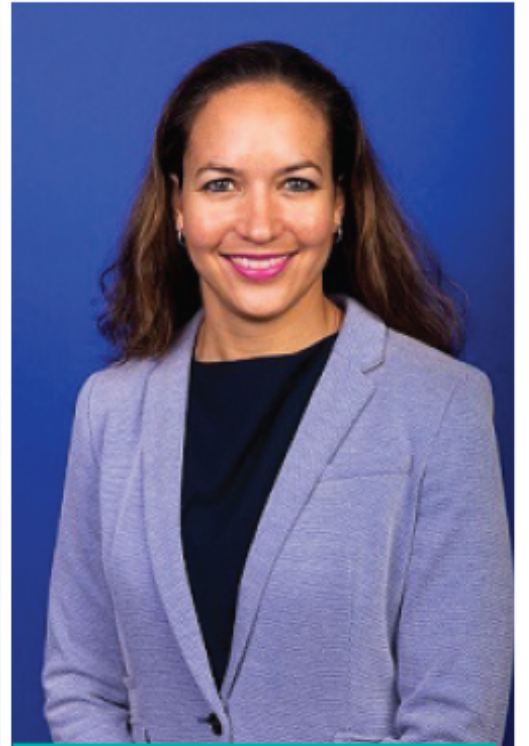

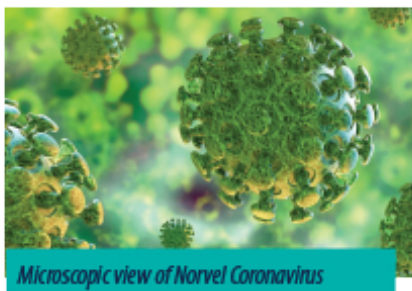

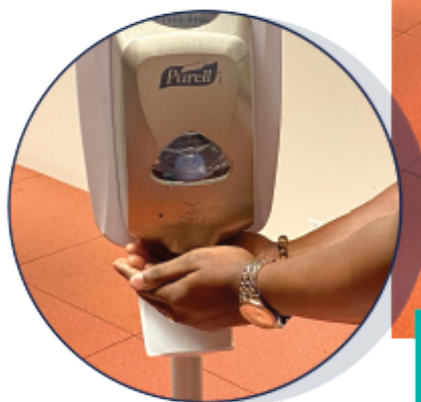


SXM AIRPORT PANDEMIC PLAN IN FULL EFFECT TO FOSTER AWARENESS ON THE NORVEL CORONAVIRUS IN THE LOW RISK AREA

As the world is on high alert towards the Norvel Coronavirus outbreak, so is the Management of the Princess Juliana International Airport – SXM. A series of emergency preparedness meetings convened during the course of last week to guarantee the SXM Airport’s Pandemic plan goes into full effect, to foster awareness and responsiveness for good hygiene practices to prevent the Norvel Coronavirus. Furthermore, following collaborative meetings with the pertinent members of the Government of St. Maarten and sector heads, the Chief Executive Officer, CEO, Brian Mingo announced that it was established that the goal is not to generate panic in our low risk area, but to be accountable for the management of the risk of communicable diseases at airports, which rests primarily with the local public health authority.

On December 31, 2019, the World Health Organization (WHO) was informed of cases of pneumonia of unknown cause, which was detected in Wuhan City, Hubei Province of China. On January 13, 2020, the Ministry of Public Health, Thailand, reported the first imported case of lab-confirmed novel coronavirus from Wuhan, Hubei Province, China. Since then, there have been more worldwide confirmed cases on the gradual rise through travel.

The plan of action for the SXM Airport includes the installation and strategic placement of additional hand sanitizer units, the pandemic plan, the Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for the frontline staff (not required at this stage), transport of travelers to a designated isolation room or health facilities and an implementation of the public and airport awareness campaign to serve to bring added awareness to our passengers, staff and airport stakeholders.

According to the Airport Council International (ACI), together with the local authorities, each airport operator should play its part towards

achieving greater coordination of preparedness measures. ACI further states that our airport preparedness plan should also address aspects such as screening logistics, equipment, entry/exit controls, and coordination with the local/regional/national public health authority. Furthermore, the International Health Regulations (2005) refers to the role of competent authorities at airports with respect to ensuring that facilities for travelers are maintained in a sanitary condition and that goods

being transported through airports are kept free of sources of infection or contamination; it concludes.
