WINAIR PILOT ROGER HODGE TO RETIRE AFTER 30 YEARS LOGGED OVER 20,000 HOURS ON THE TWIN OTTER

"I've flown His Royal Highness of the Netherlands, King Willem-Alexander, Her Royal Highness, Princess Beatrix, David Letterman and NFL football athletes," pilot, Roger Hodge modestly proclaimed.

Reflecting on his impending retirement after flying for the national carrier since February 4, 1990, Roger Hodge sentimentally pronounces the milestone as "bittersweet". Mr. Hodge will officially retire from the aviation company on October 23, 2020. The Windward Islands Airways International N.V. (WINAIR), is a government-owned airline based in Sint Maarten which was founded in 1961 by Georges Greaux. It has a fleet of seven aircraft serving ten destinations and has provided air transportation in the Caribbean for more than 55 years.

Before Roger Hodge became a pilot, his brother, the late Chairman of the Supervisory Board of Directors of the Princess Juliana International Airport, Michel Hodge encouraged him to attend his college at the F.I.T. Aviation at Florida Tech in



1976. The university specialized in aviation operations from ground school, air traffic control to simulation and flight instruction. It was there he learned the very best in aviation education for a future pilot who aspired to achieve distinction and excellence as a professional aviator.

During a recent interview with Mr. Hodge and the SXM Airport Horizon Newsletter, he disclosed that after he graduated, he started flying as a flight instructor in the United States of America, to build his hours. He was reminiscence of flying with some of the local aviators like Edwin Hodge, Kenneth Richardson, Rene Frederick and Alphonso Matthew, but he regrets never getting the opportunity to fly with the well-known aviation pioneer, Jose Dormoy. Jose Dormoy was one of WINAIR's first official pilots which was honored for his dedication and years of service.

Mr. Hodge shared that he hopes that one day WINAIR can spread its wings much further and add larger and faster aircrafts to the fleet but everything happens in due time and he is proud to be a part of an aviation company that has come a long way as the national carrier.

After having flown to the neighboring islands Saba, St. Eustatius, St. Barths, Nevis, St. Kitts and Antigua systematically for a period of years, Hodge particularly favored flying in and out of Saba and St. Barth's. The heightened level of difficulty caused by the approaches and take-offs intrigued him immeasurably. The pilot is especially gratified by the on-time departure and arrival records that they have honored for both the passengers and airline affiliates.

When asked about his views on the current operations of the Princess Juliana International Airport (PJIAE N.V.), Mr. Roger recalls the SXM Airport as was one of the nicest airports in the Caribbean, citing that he would like to see it become more improved than the pre-hurricane Irma status.

“We were headed in the right direction and if it weren’t for the destructive Hurricane Irma in September 2017, PJIAE would’ve soared higher than before. I think that they tend to do a heck of a job with what they have, and the Operations can be described as a carefully planned clockwork,” Roger Hodge says.

He cheerily recollects working with the current Chief Operations Officer of the Princess Juliana International Airport, Michel Hyman as he began his aviation journey in 1993. “We grew up at the airport and he started to work five years

after I begun to fly. I’ve had nothing but good moments with him professionally in the flight industry and I will use this opportunity to extend more power to him during this upcoming reconstruction period and to keep up the good work.”

Hodge says his personal legacy would showcase that he was also highly regarded by the Windward Islands Airways International N.V. (WINAIR) and the St. Maarten Civil Aviation Authority for his training skills and he is happy that the other pilots and passengers had full confidence in his flying. Mr. Roger Hodge have logged over 20,000 hours on the Twin Otter.



MIGUELA GUMBS APPOINTED AS MANAGER OF THE HUMAN RESOURCES DEPARTMENT AT PJIAE

“Happy employees mean a happy product and happy customers,” so says an enthused Miguela Gumbs who is the newest addition to the Human Resources Department at the Princess Juliana International Airport Operating Company N.V. (PJIAE). Gumbs successfully attained the position of Human Resources Manager and commenced her role on October 1, 2020. She joins an energetic HR team in advancing forward to guide over 270 employees of the PJIAE N.V. in Human Resource Management.

In an invited comment, Miguela Gumbs told the SXM Airport Horizon newsletter that she initially left her homeland of Sint Maarten some 25 years ago to further her studies and acquire knowledge and understanding of an alternative environment in the Netherlands.

In the Netherlands, functioning in sectors like Marketing and Human Resources at the British American Tobacco company for over a period of 15 years, Ms. Gumbs progressively worked her way over to Change Management, whereby she established a concentrated focus and passion for the fundamentals of change management and had the opportunity to learn and grow from renown HR managers and Change experts.

“In my earlier years working in the marketing department, we were mainly focused on marketing our products outside of the organization to

the customer which is logical, however with a new introduction to Change Management department I learned you can also market your company and its image inside the establishment and hence, personnel could become even more committed and proud of the product they are making or service they are providing. This would also translate into going the extra mile even when not expected to and realizing that by contributing to daily operations everyone makes a difference. I also relished in assisting and coaching employees to work in teams, thinking out of the box, motivating the staff and helping them align with the company’s strategic objectives such as Operational Excellence and Lean Management. I like to bring companies through a transition and help to them to achieve their objectives and success with the help of their employees,” divulged the HR expert.

Ms. Gumbs was also awarded positions whereby she managed a small payroll company which was responsible for the payment of 800 plus employees. In her last function in the Netherlands before immigrating to Saba, Ms. Gumbs worked for an insurance broker that handled coverage of major cargo ships that maneuvered specifically in international waters. There she set up the entire HR Department before she left to her new adventure in the Caribbean.

In 2017, Miguela Gumbs was up for a new

But it was the Government of Saba that presented the opportune role and spiked her attention through its HR objectives of further professionalizing HR throughout the organization. Over a period of three (3) years, Gumbs, in her role as Head of HRM department has advised the Executive Council of Saba and managers on various personnel related affairs and developed a tailored Leadership and Management Development Program in combination with setting the groundwork for a learning culture within the government apparatus of the Public Entity Saba. Gumbs is particularly proud of her years working for the Public Entity Saba and what she has left behind, whereby new HR policies and procedures have been introduced and aligned according to the BES laws. Personnel management has also been brought to a higher level with a learning environment for all civil servants.

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Working in a transparent and uniformed way creates clarity and understanding for all. Ms. Gumbs has now made the step and joined the PJIAE family and did not leave the managers of her former employer empty handed, after her departure she has developed a comprehensive manual in the form of a Management Toolkit, which would assist all managers to further carry out their role. The Management Toolkit includes information on, among other things, HR policies

such as sick leave management, onboarding and offboarding (from hire to retire), as well as documentation of the various trainings such as project management, time management, leadership and integrity and effective communication.

The step from commercial to the public sector and then back to the commercial sector Ms. Gumbs explained that: "I've always had a fascination with the aviation industry, but never had a real opportunity in my earlier years to work for PJIAE.

I can remember driving to the Airport just to experience the spectacular landings by major airlines such as KLM, Air France, and many more. Growing up in the Cole Bay residential area near the Airport, I would always pause with fascination whenever a large aircraft flew overhead. I'm happy to finally have the unique opportunity to work in the aviation sector, and as a bonus at the airport that I've always admired and been proud of" Miguela Gumbs concluded.

With over 75 years of aviation-based services from the Princess Juliana International Airport (SXM), the organization has underwent several undertakings like the Runway End Safety Area project (RESA), Flamingo Apron Project, Airfield Lighting Project, Air Traffic Control/Radar Facility, Departure Hall Renovation and the migration from the old to the new Terminal Building project.

Today, SXM Airport is preparing immensely for yet another renovation overhaul, as the Airport Terminal Reconstruction Project "Package 2" is set to commence in April 2021 with a completion timeline in February 2023.

In a series of interviews for the Media Campaign on the renovation project, a delegation of the PJIAE Managing Board members, CEO, Brian Mingo and COO, Michel Hyman joined the Project Director, Mirto Breell and the National Recovery Project Bureau Director, Claret Connor to better inform the masses about the latest venture of the PJIAE N.V.

The media campaign was arranged by the Corporate Communications department to have those that represent the backbone of project express their assurance of having it realized in due time.


During the collaborative interview, there was a recap of the aftermath of the Hurricane Irma of 2017 and the transition to the temporary operations of the Arrivals and Departure halls in the pavilions and back to the Terminal Building. The panelists also spoke about the project funders like the Trust Fund and European Investment Bank (EIB), the World Bank who serves as the fund managers and the implementing agency which is the National Recovery Project Bureau. Announcements were also made about the start of the Mold Remediation and the Waste Disposal which will go into effect in the last quarter of 2020.


